Travel/Study course: Peru

Students register in a total of six (6) credit hours.
PBDE students register in EDUA 5200 T60 and EDUA 5230 T60; MEd and PhD students register in EDUA 5230 T60 and EDUA 7330 T60.

The travel study course begins in Lima with two weeks in Cusco, Machu Pichu, Puno (Indigenous Floating Island communities of Uros and Taquile located on Lake Titicaca). Students will examine the comparisons and contrasts of Indigenous and cross cultural experiences that can enrich perspectives in education, and other interrelated disciplines.

Through readings, story work, field visits with peoples/archeological/communities, observational skills, engaging with community leaders/scholars and traditional ceremonies and education, students will learn about the historical to present Indigenous-Modern relationships; ways that lived experiences of past peoples/ancestors' artefacts and knowledges are repatriated for current Indigenous inspired aspirations within Peruvian context; archeological sites and the richness of knowledges; selected Indigenous cultures lived expressions of language, culture, and economy in Peru; and e) the ongoing themes and issues that challenge traditional knowledges and examine models of re-engagement with Indigenous perspectives. In addition we will visit Indigenous communities and learn how they engage with their Indigenous knowledges in present lifeways and discuss ways these connect to Canadian Indigenous perspectives. Students will review literature that addresses Indigenous knowledges and perspectives on Indigenous repatriation, language renewal, cultural reclaiming, culturally relevant teaching and research practices and theories. Local university student mentors will work with us to be our 'eyes, ears, and voices'.

The travel fee is \$1,800.00 CAD (subject to change) includes accommodation with breakfast in most places, in-country ground/boat transportation (buses, taxis, host drivers, boat, train etc.), most museum/site entrances admissions and host country speakers fees. Students are responsible for own meals not attached to accommodation arrangements. Airfare (international and domestic), health and trip cancellation insurance, as well as University of Manitoba tuition **are not** included in this travel fee.

Travel fees may be paid by cheque (payable to the University of Manitoba, VISA, Mastercard or in cash). The Travel Fee Payment Schedule is as follows:



A payment of \$500.00 CAD is due April 17, 2015 (includes a \$200.00 non-refundable deposit). Participants may be accepted later, space permitting. A second payment (1300.00) is due May 15, 2015.

All participants must have approval of the course instructor, although a selection process will be conducted by the individual faculties involved.

In order to participate in a travel/study course, all participants and students must sign an Acknowledgment of Responsibility and Liability Waiver that outlines risk and shared responsibility associated with travel/study. As well, students need to submit a course planning information form. This form will be provided to registered participants. Participants are required to attend pre-departure sessions.

Participants are advised that a passport is required. Canadian citizens do not require a tourist visa to enter Peru, but non-Canadians may require visas (advance notice of status to instructor is required).

Participants and students are advised to contact the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority (WHRA) for information on immunization requirements, (204) 940-8747. Please contact the WRHA early as some immunization must be taken well in advance of travel.
